The Global Wave is an international mobilization calling on governments to abolish nuclear weapons and re-invest the \$100 billion global nuclear weapons budget into areas of social need such as eliminating poverty, addressing climate change, and ensuring basic health care and education world-wide.

The Global Wave will start in New York and then proceed through each time zone around the world. It is timed to coincide with the opening of the Nuclear Non-Proliferation Treaty (NPT) review conference, where governments meet to discuss nuclear non-proliferation and disarmament.
